The Faculty of Sociology, Ryukoku University, invites applications for one full-time, a tenured position of associate professor or lecturer. The Faculty would appreciate your sharing this announcement with interested parties.

1. Affiliated faculty/department:

Ryukoku University, Kyoto Fukakusa Campus, 67 Fukakusa, Tsukamotocho, Fushimi Ward, Kyoto City, Kyoto Prefecture

3. Main Classes to be Taught:

“Method of Qualitative Research” or” Social Statistics I ”

4. Anticipated Position: Associate Professor or Lecturer

5. Number of Positions: 1

6. Starting Date of Employment: 1 April 2027

7. Required Qualifications:

- 1) Doctor’s degree or equivalent level (including those who expect to receive their doctoral degree during the fiscal year 2026).
- 2) In addition to their main classes candidates must be able to teach courses (G courses) that provide hands-on experience and instruction in social research as part of the Certified Social Researcher curriculum.
- 3) The willingness and ability to actively contribute to the administrative tasks in the university and the faculty, such as entrance examinations and committees.
- 4) For those whose first language is not Japanese, the applicant must have sufficient Japanese language ability to perform the duties of the university.

- 2) List of academic achievements (JREC-IN Format)
- 3) Four most significant publications (Must include at least three articles or books published in the last

5 years.)

9. Document Submission Deadline: Must be received no later than 3 August 2026

10. Selection Process:

- 1) Applicants who pass the first selection (document screening) will be notified separately by email.
- 2) The second round of selection (interviews and mock lessons) is scheduled to take place after August.
- 3) As a rule, transportation and lodging expenses associated with the selection process will not be provided.
- 4) Applicants will be notified of the results by email on Thursday, October 1.
- 5) During the screening process, you may be asked to submit items 1) and 2) under "8. Required Documents" again in our university's format.

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(a) To receive a total payment of 1.5 million yen or more, as specified in the above table, the applicant must include in the plan a continuous period of at least two months (60 days) of research activities conducted abroad, based on an invitation letter from an institution outside Japan.

(b) Even if the total duration of research activities conducted abroad exceeds three months (90 days), if the conditions described in item (a) are not met, the maximum amount to be paid shall be limited to 1,000,000 yen, regardless of the provisions in the above table.
