Language and Communication Program

Through the execution of conscientious research into issues relating to language and communication within a global society, and through the synthesis of multifaceted and big-picture perspectives on the ways in which mutual relations affect the international situation, the Graduate School seeks to develop leaders with high-level communication and language skills, capable of independent action and problem resolution.

To this end, the Graduate School seeks Applicants with the following interests and aspirations:

- Applicants who wish to promote mutual understanding through the acquisition of knowledge, tolerance, and a flexible and critical perspective towards their research objective, while simultaneously demonstrating leadership, high-level language proficiency, and diplomatic skills.

Bank Transfer from Financial Institutions (Japanese yen only)

Please be aware of the following points when wiring money from overseas banks. All handling fees imposed by banks shall be paid by the Applicant, which include the fees for banks outside of Japan as well as fees for receiving banks in Japan. The exact amount will depend on the country and the institution. - 1. Please pay the Admission Fee deposit of 100,000 yen during Admission Period I. (In the case of admissions of non-traditional students for the Master's Program, the amount of the deposit is 50,000 yen.)
- During Admission Period II, please complete the April-intake semester tuition and fees subtracting paid admission fee deposit.
 Please note that successful Applicants applying for admissions for non-traditional students who finish their Master's program at Ryukoku will be exempted from payment during Admission Period II.

(Spring Screening for Master's Program • Spring Screening for Doctor's Program)

1. Please complete April-intake semester tuition and fees in a lump sum payment during the admission enrollment period. Please note that successful Applicants applying for admissions for non-traditional students who finish their Master's program need to pay the Admission Fee deposit of 50,000 yen in a lump sum payment.

XOut of all the payment at the time of entrance procedure, the amount of admission fee deposit is 100,000 yen. (In case of admissions for non-traditional students for Master's Program, the deposit is 50,000 yen.)

Tuition and Fee Refund Guidelines

When a successful Applicant declines admission after completing all of the admissions procedures, necessary arrangements must be made no later than 3:00 pm on March 31, 2019. Only when completing the prescribed necessary arrangements, fees paid while completing the entrance procedures (except for Admission Fee) can be refunded.
