

Steps to Students Should Take to Deal with the Novel Coronavirus (COVID-19)

COVID-19 has been designated as an infectious disease and its spread in should be prevented in schools. In the event Items 1, 2 and/or 3 applies to you, do not come to school

1 Do you have the following symptoms?

- (1) If you have a serious condition, such as difficulty in breathing (dyspnea), severe fatigue (malaise), or high fever
- (2) If you are at risk for severe disease and have relatively mild cold symptoms, such as fever and cough
- (3) If you do not fall under the above and have relatively mild cold symptoms, such as fever and cough

2 Came in contact with a person infected with COVID-19 or someone who has been in close contact with someone infected with COVID-19

- (1) Anyone who has had contact with a person infected with COVID-19 or someone who has been in close contact with someone infected with COVID-19

3 Returned to Japan from overseas or has come to Japan within the past 14 days or less

- (1) Anyone returning to Japan from overseas or anyone that have come to Japan within the past 14 days or less regardless of whether you have symptoms

Contact the Kikokusha-Sesshokusha Sodan Center (consultation center for those returning to Japan or who have come in contact with an infected person)

Immediately contact the university and carry out health management

Immediately consult the Kikokusha-Sesshokusha Sodan Center (consultation center for those returning to Japan or who have come in contact with an infected person) after confirming your symptoms or if you believe you have come in close contact with an infected individual. Then inform the university. Call or email the registrar's office of the department (faculty) you belong to.

Immediately contact the university and carry out health management

Immediately call or email the registrar's office of the department (faculty) you belong to if you have just returned to Japan from overseas or if have just come to Japan within the past 14 days or less, regardless of whether you have symptoms. After this, stay at home and monitor your temperature and health conditions.

Must get examined

No need for an exam

Outpatient consultation services from those returning to Japan or those who have come in close contact with an infected person

Call or email the registrar's office of the department (faculty) you belong to and let them know the results of your consultation prior to going to school.

If you test positive

If you test negative

Follow the instructions given to you by the doctor (hospital). Report the results of your medical exam to the registrar's office of the department (faculty) you belong to without fail. Also, appropriately report the progress of your treatment.

Report the results of your exam to the registrar's office of the department (faculty) you belong to. Stay at home until you have been cleared by the hospital and have no symptoms.

If 1 and/or 2 applies within 14 days after returning to Japan or coming to visit Japan

Follow the flow for **1** or **2**

14 days have passed and you show no symptoms

Prior to going to school, report the results of the observations you made of your own health and report them to the registrar's office of the department (faculty) you belong to.

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
